A full body MRI provides direct visual evidence of good health, or it can detect a lurking problem of which you and your doctor may not have been aware. It can uncover silent conditions like early-stage cancers of the pancreas, liver and kidneys, aneurysms, hidden visceral fat and other chronic conditions that are not revealed with standard blood tests or by an external physical examination. Detecting these problems early is only possible with preventive imaging.

The full body MRI at Abercrombie Radiology is the most comprehensive visual anatomical assessment available. This comprehensive evaluation of the inside of your body is performed without any ionizing radiation. The results are interpreted by a radiologist, a doctor specialized and experienced in diagnosing diseases and health conditions of the brain, vascular system and the internal organs within the chest, abdomen and pelvis.

The full body MRI, combined with a consultation with one of our radiologists, lets you know where you are at the greatest risk. In doing so, you can work with your doctor and other health professionals to develop a sound plan to stay healthy.

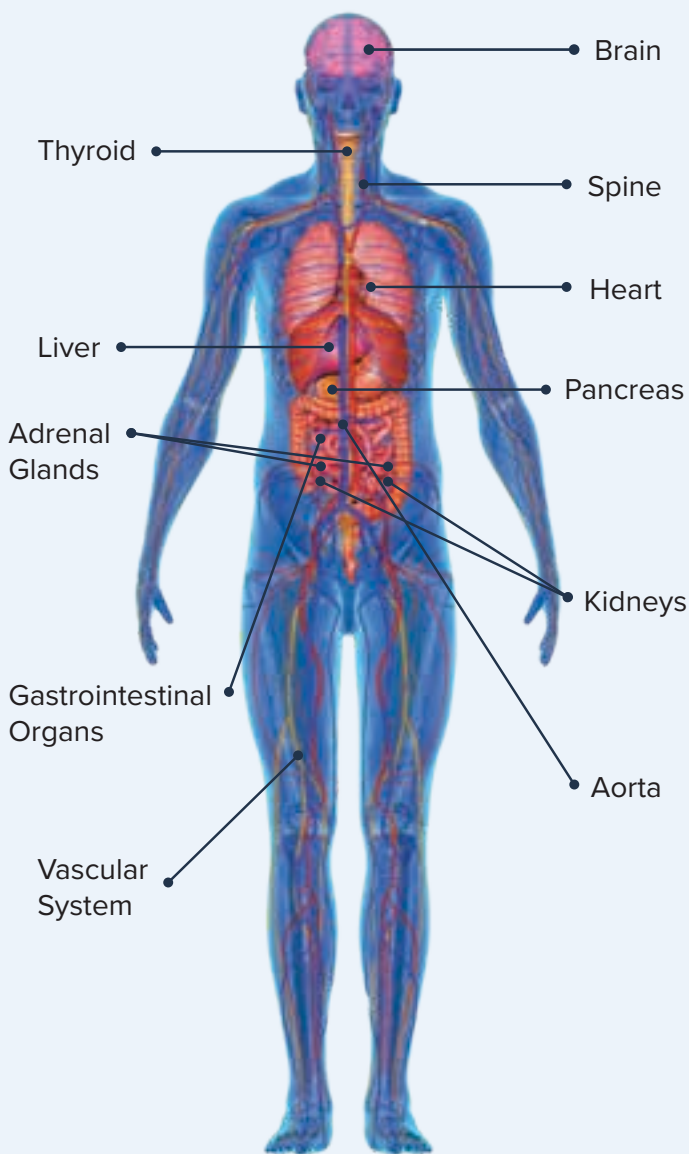

What does the full body MRI cover?



Cancer: Early detection increases the 5-year survival rate to nearly 90%

Heart Disease: Early detection reduces heart disease mortality risk by over 50%

Brain Abnormalities: Detect neurological problems 2-3 years before symptoms appear

Aneurysms: Often treatable if detected before they rupture

Early detection. When health abnormalities are identified early, treatment outcomes are improved.



Radiation-free. Unlike CT scans, which use radiation, MRIs use magnetic fields and radio waves, which makes them a safer option for repeated scanning.



Detailed, high-resolution images. MRI provides excellent visualization of soft tissues, muscles, ligaments and nerves, enabling our doctors to detect problems that could be missed with other medical tests.



Comprehensive assessment. A single scan provides a complete overview of the major organs instead of separate scans for different areas of the body.
